2. Raz Kids is an online site that also engages young readers with developmentally leveled books at 27 reading levels to increase comprehension and fluency. These leveled readers can be done with or without sound. Comprehension questions are also available.
3. TumbleBooks – eBooks for eKids! The Tumble Book Library is an online collection of animated, talking picture books which teach young children the joys of reading. Like the Raz Kids site, these books can also be done without sound and have comprehension questions available for each story.
